

Sheldon, Krebs Prevail Over 3.52-mile Roxbury Run

ROXBURY – Two-time season champion Jeff Sheldon and two-time female season titlist Theresa Krebs took the blue ribbons Saturday, Nov. 16, at the Roxbury Road Races over a 3.52-mile loop.

Sheldon, 33, of Southbury was the overall winner 20-minutes, 53-seconds over the rolling course, which included a jaunt down the long hill on Hemlock Road.

Krebs annexed her 28th win this season in the female division in the weekly series by taking 11th place overall in 24:13.

The series will continue Saturday, Nov. 23, at 8:30 a.m. with another run over the 3.52-mile layout, except in the opposite direction starting and finishing near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane. There will be no entry fee.

The 13th annual 3.0-mile Run For The Cure will be held Thursday, Nov. 28, Thanksgiving Day, at the Roxbury Congregational Church on Route 317.

The short, children's run will commence at 9 a.m. The walkers and strollers will take off at 9:15 and the runners will begin at 9:30 over the challenging layout.

There will be a \$10 entry fee that can be paid that morning from 7:30 to 9:20 at the church. Proceeds will go to the cancer center at New Milford Hospital, the American Cancer Society's Relay For Life Shepaug Valley Chapter and to purchase a new digital stop watch for the road race series.

The top overall male and female will each receive a plaque.

Refreshments will be available.
