## Sandifer Staggered-Start Run Slated For September 24 At Roxbury

ROXBURY – The Ed Sandifer staggered-start race - named after a former Boston Marathon regular, local running standout and university professor – will be held again by the Roxbury Road Race Series.

The popular 2.4-mile event is scheduled for Saturday, September 24, at 8:30 a.m. The runners will take off from the starting line based on their ability. There are usually clusters of runners of differing ability approaching the finish line.

The weekly series compiles results on both the staggered-start finishes and the actual times.

Sandifer, who won the Roxbury season series 12 times after moving to the area in 1986, started the event in 1988.

The Newtown resident completed the Boston Marathon every year from 1973 through 2009. He suffered a stroke in August 2009. He taught Math and Business for 23 years at Western Connecticut State University in Danbury.

He has attended the staggered start race throughout the recent years.

There will be a \$5 entry fee that can be paid that morning from 7 to 8:20 a.m. Proceeds will go to Sandifer, who has regularly donated them to the series' T-shirt/grants campaign. The runners distribute T-shirts each November and in April they donate grants to high school cross country programs in the area.

The race, which is sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, will start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
