

Levy, Deming Race To Roxbury Mile I

ROXBURY – On the Indy 500 weekend, Alana Levy and Chris Deming earned the right to drink from the victory bottle of milk at the Roxbury Mile I.

Levy, became what is believed to be only the second female to be the overall champion in a race in the weekly series, which began in 1977.

Alison Masopust, 34, of Morris became the first earlier this spring.

Levy, 29, a native of Chapaqua, N.Y. who began running in the series as a middle school student, was timed in 5-minutes, 33-seconds on the loop that went from near the end of Apple Lane to just beyond the edge of the parking lot at the Booth Free School on South Street.

Deming, 51, of Danbury was clocked in 5:41 in the Saturday, May 26, event. It was his fourth victory this year in the male division.

The weekly Roxbury Road Races Club series will continue on Saturday, June 2, at 8:30 a.m. with the 9.9-mile Moosehorn Run.

Runners can enter through the \$25 season membership or the \$2 weekly waiver.

Youth runners can enter for free after signing a weekly waiver.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, usually start and finish near the Everett Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
