Consalvo Posts Impressive Victory At Roxbury Race

ROXBURY – Thomas Consalvo, 24, a former standout at Brookfield High School and Quinnipiac University was more than five minutes ahead of his closes pursuer in winning a 4.3-mile race at the weekly Roxbury Road Runners Club series.

He was timed in 24:07- a 5:36-per-mile pace - on Saturday, April 8, over the route that included a trip up the hill on High Bridge Road. It was one of the most impressive performances in the 47-year history of the series and his second win of the season.

Mark Andrejczyk, 50, of Shelton placed second in 29:42.

Three-time former women's series season champion Alison Masopust, 39, of Morris was the first female finisher and took 10th overall with a 32:22 clocking

The series will continue on Saturday, April 15, at 8:30 a.m. with a 5.0-mile race that will include a journey down the hill on Squire Road.

Runners can compete through the \$25 season membership. They also participate by completing the weekly waiver form. If they have a timing chip the cost is \$2. If they do not have a chip the fee is \$2. Youth runners, current and former members of military or first responders can compete for free after completing the weekly waiver form.

The races, which are sanctioned by the Roxbury Recreation Commission, start and finish near the Everett B. Hurlburt Community Park at 18 Apple Lane.
